

As mentioned in our previous newsletter, Emilie Cooper advised PMHC of our legal rights regarding the lease and the demountables. Lance and I were asked to attend a meeting with PMHC and not surprisingly they aren't budging.

Their legal advice is that they do have a valid license and therefore have no intention of handing over the buildings. They have now advised our solicitor of this in writing and Lance and I will meet again

to plan the next step.
We asked PMHC to indicate what their long-term plans were for the land the Players sits on, particularly as they've been slowly purchasing the land surrounding us.

Their representatives informed us that there were no plans to make a play for our land and they are certain our lease will be renewed without issue. I am inclined to trust them about as much as a chocolate fire guard but at this time we can only take them at their word. This makes increasing our community exposure even more pertinent. We will update you all again after our next meeting with Emilie.





Retail Report By Amie Frank

Since taking over the Retail portfolio just prior to "Singin' in the Rain", we have been working hard on streamlining processes, trialling new things and adding and re-instating a few things to keep us compliant from a regulatory standpoint.

Front of House

Layout - Those of you who came to see "Singin' in the Rain" would have noticed a slightly different layout in the foyer, with some of the seating configured in an "L" shape with coffee tables as well as the high tables in the middle of the room with stools. We trialled this layout to encourage more conversation between patrons and to create a more relaxed feel. We also moved the seating away from the photo board wall so people sitting don't have someone's "crutch" in their face from others standing, trying to read the board. So far, the feedback has been very positive and constructive. We will continue to tweak

We will continue to tweak the layout to better utilise the space.

Furniture - We are currently in the process of researching the purchase of new furniture for the foyer as the old furniture is looking a little tired. We may have the opportunity of some sponsorship so stay tuned for further developments.

We have some surprises up our sleeve to further improve the look and modernise the foyer area so stay tuned.

Bar

We spent several days and nights cleaning, clearing and generally tidying the bar area and the associated stock/storeroom. Feedback from those who volunteered during "Singin' in the Rain" was very positive.

Stock Tracking/BarCoding

We have introduced and commenced using the stock tracking module in our existing "Square" point of sale system, as well as purchasing a bar code scanner. This was done to get a better understanding of what's being sold as well as to provide transparency through more effective financial reporting.

changes to liquor license regulations has resulted in the need to make some changes to the way we do things so we stay compliant. We have re-introduced the bollards in front of the bar as we needed a way to distinguish between the under and over 18 year old patron access to the bar. They also provide better flow for patrons when purchasing.



While the bar is in service (alcohol being served), under 18 year old patrons, members and/or performers are not allowed at the bar without responsible adult supervision (over 18).

Retail Report By Amie Frank

The entry "barn" style door into the bar area will always be locked during bar service.

Anyone under 18 needing anything from within the bar area will need to either ask someone over the age of 18 to collect it for them or approach this side door to ask bar staff to retrieve it for them.

Re-usable glasses -

We now have re-usable glassware which can be taken into the auditorium. They were introduced and used during "Singin' in the Rain" and have been well received. We need to make sure these glasses are returned to the bar and not taken home as keepsakes. If you see anyone that may have mistakenly taken the glasses home could you encourage them to return the glasses to the bar.

Reusable mugs - Thank you to those who are using their own mugs during rehearsals and set construction. This has been greatly appreciated and will help in cutting down our carbon footprint.



Environmental Response Update

Players Theatre is always looking at ways to reduce waste and improve our recycling habits.

In light of this we wish to advise that *foam cups will be phased out* by the opening of our next show: **Look Who's Talking.**

What does this mean?

In the bar/kitchen we will no longer provide disposable foam cups for tea and coffee. We encourage all members who rehearse or meet at the theatre to bring their own keep cup, mug or reusable item.

Should you need to use a cup or mug from the kitchen you will be responsible for washing, drying and putting away your item.

Please also note that Players Theatre branded drinkware will be introduced for use when taking beverages into the auditorium during shows.

These new tumblers are <u>dishwasher safe and reusable</u> which we know you will agree is far better than our single use plastics of the past.

We still recycle all glass bottles, cans, cardboard and paper as normal.
