Bonnie and Clyde is Kate's directorial debut since graduating from the University of New England in 2023 with her Bachelor of Arts degree majoring in Theatre and Performance. Kate's most enjoyable part of the rehearsal process was the building of strong and positive relationships with the cast, band and crew, as well as the constant support provided by the Production Team.

Kate is delighted to be playing the role of Juliet Capulet in Taree Arts Council's upcoming production of "& Juliet" set to hit the Manning Entertainment Centre stage this coming October.

Beyond the spotlight, she has contributed as Assistant Director and backstage crew for many productions. Designing the set for *Bonnie and Clyde* has been an exciting new challenge for Amanda - turning the rough sketches into a stage space that enhances storytelling and celebrates the cast's incredible talent has been genuinely thrilling.

Peter has a long association with The Players Theatre and even attended the first musical held in this building - *The Pirates of Penzance* in 1984 as his high school music teacher was in the ensemble. Even earlier, Peter and his mother went to Sydney to see every piece of theatre available, and now as a high school music teacher, he aspires to bring the joy of theatre to his own students.

He is especially pleased to be working with one such ex-student - Kate Simpson - in her first directing role. They previously worked together at Players Theatre in *Chicago* (2023), *FAME* (2024) and *Legally Blonde the Muiscal* (2024) where Peter was the Musical Director and Kate was either the choreographer or in the cast. "Kate's vision for Bonnie and Clyde, underpinned by her own 'triple-threat' (skilled in music, dance and drama), has been a testament to her dedication to theatre, and her desire to see more young people on the Players Theatre stage."

Up in our specially built mezzanine band stage, Peter leads his team of outstanding local musicians committed to bringing this excellent score to life, and supporting the great talent seen on stage. Peter is ably assisted to rehearse by his two Staffy pups; Kiwi and Raven, who ensure there is no edible furniture left in the house, other than his piano and seat.

Shontelle started her love and passion for the arts in primary school as a flutist in the band and was a soprano in the school choir, with her first taste of musical theatre being a Westport High School production of *Disco Inferno*, playing the part of Kathy.

At The Players Theatre, Shontelle has enjoyed the roles of Ermengarde in *Hello Dolly* (2008), Linda in *The Wedding Singer* (2022), the femme fatale Roxie Hart in *Chicago* (2023), and last year as Pilar in *Legally Blonde the Musical*.

She has also been the vocal director for three productions and absolutely loves this role. "Watching the joy in the casts faces bringing this show to life has been so fulfilling. Also hearing the emotional connection to the beautiful lyrics and the wonderful tonality. I'm blessed with such talent in this production. This production has been such a pleasure to be a part of creating, I hope you all enjoy hearing it as much as I have, it's honestly going to blow you away. I can guarantee you'll be singing the songs for days to come after you see it."

Shontelle has studied music theatre and is hoping in the future to teach vocals specific to musical theatre and accent work in her home studio and potentially also direct a show.





Director's Notes

I had previously tried to direct this musical back in 2020, while I was studying at UNE and residing at Earle Page College. Unfortunately, COVID shut down my dreams and the show was unable to go ahead. Fast forward to 2024, whilst on a whim, I decided to "shoot my shot" a second time. Thankfully, The Players Theatre gave me a chance to live out my directorial dream of bringing this infamous story to a stage.

I would firstly like to thank the eleven production team members behind this show. Collectively, they have all given me an immense amount of support and respect stepping into this journey. 
